



Missouri's diverse landscape is dotted with lakes of all shapes and sizes - with hundreds of miles of shoreline and thousands of acres of water to explore.



THE PIVOT

It's no secret that the pandemic took a toll on restaurants, and many temporarily adjusted their operations to keep the doors open. Others developed an entirely different approach and were so successful they never looked back.

Prior to the pandemic, Catalpa offered a fine dining experience in the tiny town of Arrow Rock. When owner and chef Liz Huff had to close the intimate eatery, she welcomed diners to the patio and lawn for gourmet burgers and boozy shakes. A year later, Huff moved her reimagined

restaurant to a new, larger location, kept the more casual menu, and added sandwiches, salads and pizza. Try the Sweet Ginger Burger adorned with roasted peppers and onion and fresh ginger teriyaki sauce or a "white pizza" that combines grilled chicken with dried figs, sour cherries, apricots, crystallized ginger, fresh spinach and shaved parmesan. Spiked milkshake options include the Pink Squirrel, a popular menu option flavored with amaretto and white chocolate liqueur and sprinkled with edible pink glitter.

Like many restaurants, Olive + Oak, located near St. Louis in Webster Groves,

offered patio dining and curbside pickup during the early days of the pandemic. Owner Mark Hinkle and executive chef Mike Risk also responded to the growing demand for pizza by opening a new restaurant inspired by the neighborhood trattorias found throughout Italy. O+O Pizza serves thin-crust pies, pasta and other specialties, including handmade toasted ravioli — a St. Louis tradition. Order the classic Margherita Pizza topped with tomato sauce, basil, mozzarella and pecorino or the more complex Prosciutto Pizza with butternut squash, fig honey and burrata, a soft Italian cheese.

COUNTER-INTUITIVE

Counter service is convenient when you want to pick up something quick — a bagel for breakfast, a burger for lunch. But some culinary counters in the Show-Me State go beyond the expected, offering surprising and award-winning — fare.

Missouri might seem an unlikely place to discover the flavors of Bosnia, but Balkan Treat Box in St. Louis has received rave reviews for its Balkan specialties. The restaurant serves wood-fired flatbreads filled with sausages, grilled fish, a variety of vegetables, herbs, cheese and sauces. The Patlidžan features roasted eggplant, cheese, cabbage, cucumber, tomato, pickles, egg, pistachio and apricot-pomearanate molasses.

For fast Middle Eastern cuisine, head to Beet Box in Columbia, Order a breakfast burrito or wrap stuffed with Koobideh, a meat kebab made from ground lamb or beef, or try the Falafel, deep fried chickpea

patties. Sides include Marinated Kale Salad and Za'atar Fries with Harissa Mayo. An assortment of baked goods includes Rugelach and Galettes. The menu revolves heavily around specials with new dishes making an appearance on a regular basis.

MOBILE BEGINNINGS

Food trucks are a fun way to explore a city's culinary scene. But when demand outgrew capacity, some of Missouri's most popular mobile restaurants decided it was time to open a brick-and-mortar locale.

Biscuits are an Ozarks staple - often slathered with butter and blackberry jam or covered with sausage gravy. You can enjoy traditional toppings at Ozark Mountain Biscuit & Bar in Columbia, but the restaurant - with food truck roots - turns its scratch-made buttermilk biscuits into sandwiches piled high with locally sourced meats and vegetables. The Boss Hog layers on pulled pork, greens, sausage gravy, a fried egg, crispy onions and barbecue sauce. In addition to biscuit sandwiches, savor a variety of flavors from the South such as shrimp and grits, fried or blackened catfish, and country fried streak.

A long-time food truck favorite, The Wheelhouse serves Thai-Mexican fusion

> food at its location inside Vib, a boutique hotel in Springfield. The restaurant toasts and grinds its own spices and makes its own salsas and marinades. The tacos - vegetable, chicken, tofu, pork or shrimp - are drizzled with roasted tomatillo sauce or Thai peanut sauce and served with chips, salsa, and bean or cabbage dip. The pineapple fried rice, a popular menu item, combines jasmine rice (steamed with lemongrass, turmeric, coconut milk and lime leaves) with broccoli, carrots, cabbage, fresh pineapple, mushrooms, Vietnamese soy sauce and ginger-habanero coconut oil.

THE QUEST

Searching for the best dishes a destination has to offer is always a worthy endeavor. And nothing inspires a food odyssey in Missouri quite like barbecue. Other states may claim their smoked meats can't be beat, but no other place has shown us that they can top Show-Me State barbecue.

No quest for the best barbecue is complete without a trip to Kansas City. From the time Henry Perry began selling slabs of smoked meat next to his streetcar barn in the early 1900s, Kansas City was on course to become a barbecue mecca. Classics like **Arthur Bryant's Barbeque** and **Gates Bar-B-Q**, dating back to the 1930s and 1940s, are famous for their pulled pork, racks of ribs and burnt ends — crispy chunks of beef brisket that are a Kansas City specialty. Newer barbecue spots like **Char Bar** and **Q39** have created interesting twists on old favorites and vegetarian options, too.

The region boasts more than 100 barbecue restaurants, so you might need some help navigating the

smokey, saucy offerings. Download the KC BBQ Experience app for detailed information about Kansas City's signature cuisine.

On the other side of the state, the St. Louis area has been building its own barbecue legacy with dozens of popular spots, such as **Pappy's Smokehouse**, **Sugarfire Smokehouse** and **Salt + Smoke**. All three restaurants have multiple locations that make it easy to get your barbecue fix.

Barbecue thrives outside the Show-Me State's metro areas as well. Missouri Hick Bar-B-Que in Cuba, Missouri, is a favorite stop on historic Route 66. In the southwest corner of the state, Gettin' Basted approaches barbecue a little differently, smoking their meat with higher heat for a shorter amount of time. The restaurant serves up its award-winning barbecue at several locations in southwest Missouri, including Branson and Springfield.

FARM FOCUSED

The Ozark Mill, originally built in 1833, is the centerpiece of Finley Farms, located on the banks of the Finley River in the southwest Missouri town of Ozark. After an extensive renovation, the mill has been restored, and the property is home to three "farm-forward" restaurants - all featuring local sustainable food, including produce grown on site. The Ozark Mill Restaurant is a family-friendly dining experience serving seasonal dishes, pasta and sourdough pizza. Try the Hog and Feed pie with roasted corn and smoked bacon, alfredo sauce and chives. Among the dinner selections are Pork Shank, Crispy Catfish and Ricotta Ravioli. The Workshop serves a variety of coffee drinks, teas and cocktails, toasts with avocado, bacon and heirloom tomatoes,

and other light fare. A fine-dining experience with shareable plates and craft cocktails awaits at The Garrison, a hideaway tucked beneath the mill. Fire pits provide a warm glow on the patio with views of the river and the historic Riverside Bridge.

Farm-fresh vegetables take center stage at Vicia in St. Louis. Make a reservation for the Farmer's Feast, and the chefs will create a three-course meal based on an ever-changing assortment of ingredients that come into



the kitchen each day. You might have vegetable tacos or tempura green beans with honey mustard for starters. The main course could be locally produced pork with green tomato and horseradish jam or oyster mushrooms with charred scallion vinaigrette. Desert possibilities include snap pea ice cream, lemon verbena cake, or summer fruits and berries. You can also stop in at the bar for drinks and small bites from their a la carte snack menu - no reservation necessary.


the hunt for the unexpected



urgers are the epitome of casual dining. But in Kansas City, some elevated spots are serving up burgers that challenge the status quo. Head to the elegant lobby bar at Hotel Kansas City and order a cheeseburger to go with an expertly crafted cocktail. The caramelized onions and gooey cheese make for one decadent dish. If you're hungry for more, The Town Company is only a few steps away and provides an experience and food sure to impress.

Corvino Supper Club, an establishment that has received nods from the James Beard Foundation, focuses on upscale dining and tasting menus. When perusing the main dining room menu, you'll find a simple, gourmet cheeseburger topped with aioli, charred onions, pickles and muenster cheese that will have you ordering a second.

Hard-core carnivores will get the chance to step out of their comfort zone at Pirate's Bone Burger. You might expect the usual fare from this tiny shop, but you'll be surprised to find a menu full of plant-based burgers. While traditional beef is swapped for meatless alternatives, these sandwiches still pack a flavorful punch guaranteed to please any burger lover.





Hop on Amtrak's Missouri River Runner

t's often said that travel is about the journey — not the destination. That said, we offer up for your consideration: the Missouri River Runner.

Even if you overlook the romantic history of train travel — and why would you? — this method of transportation gives us the one thing we all seek: escape. Skip the busy airport, the traffic, the responsibility; just relax and rediscover the joy of simply getting there.

Once aboard and underway, travelers may find it difficult to resist the impulse to doze off to the distinctive rhythm of the train, but you really shouldn't miss the passing scenery that provides constant visual delights as the route follows the Missouri River across much of the state.

Every season offers its own natural art: spring green that lasts only a week or two each year, fields of purple henbit and forests splashed with blooming dogwoods and redbuds.

The vivid blues and greens of summer can beckon you to disembark for a hike or ride on the Katy Trail. How lucky that your bike can ride the train with you.

Missouri dresses itself for fall in a coat of many colors, each tree donning its own specific hue in a forest decorated with pops of red sumac. It may well be the most popular time for train travel.

In winter, even at rest, the forests and fields reveal glimpses of the state's abundant wildlife, and occasionally, you'll find it decorated in pillows of pristine white.

And year-round, the breathtaking Big Muddy always makes an appearance.

The Missouri River Runner's ten stops offer opportunities to experience quaint small towns; visit festivals filled with music, food and fun; discover rich history; go adventuring in the Show-Me State's outdoors paradise; and experience the excitement of Missouri's largest cities.

So perhaps we should rephrase. When it comes to the Missouri River Runner, it's about both the journey AND the destination. How can travel be more perfect?

THE SPIRITS

MISSOURI BOURBON | EST. 2019

ALL BOURBON IS WHISKEY. BUT NOT ALL WHISKEY IS BOURBON. AND ONLY A SPECIAL, SELECT FEW QUALIFY AS MISSOURI BOURBON.

ove over, Kentucky. Step aside, Tennessee; Missouri is upping its game. No, we're not talking football or basketball. We're talking bourbon.

Bourbon is America's only native spirit. Although any country can distill whiskey, bourbon can only be made in the U.S.A. Many people believe the only places in the country that can make it are Kentucky and Tennessee. Granted, they may be the best known — and Kentucky currently produces 95% of the supply — but any state can do it.

You see, Tennessee whiskey and Kentucky bourbon are just bottled in those states. The ingredients can come from anywhere, and the oak barrels often come from, well, Missouri. So how are we different? As of 2019, from growing the corn to

aging the spirit to bottling the product, our bourbon is Missouri through and through.

By federal law, bourbon must be at least 51% corn, be distilled to more than 80 proof but less than 160 proof (which allows it to retain more of the flavors of the grains) and aged in a new, charred oak barrel. That's it. Those are all the rules. So even if the alcohol came from Kansas and was aged in Indiana, it could be named for the place in which it was bottled. But now, that's changed in Missouri.

Bourbon was king from the 1940s through the 1970s, before other alcohols dethroned it. But today, bourbon is experiencing a resurgence in popularity. And due to legislation approved in the Show-Me State, discerning drinkers are discovering and embracing Missouri bourbon.

According to Don Gosen, owner of Copper Mule Distillery in Hermann, the goal was to "make a high-class bourbon and make it truly a Missouri product — not just made in Missouri, but made from Missouri raw materials. We're the only state in the country that can have this legislation. We have the white oak, we have the corn."

The Missouri Craft Distillers Guild pushed the measure heavily, having seen the advantage of pairing agriculture with tourism. A similar cooperative effort has been proven successful for the wine industry, with both in-state and out-of-state travelers flocking to wine trails all over Missouri.

Using that as inspiration, the Guild designed a promotion of their own to attract visitors to sample their wares — bourbon

and other spirits. The Missouri Spirits Expedition encourages tourists to visit all participating Guild member distilleries, after which, they get a free bottle of bourbon — Missouri bourbon that is.

The Expedition is already a success. Gosen says, "Here in Hermann, we now have three distilleries. It's given people new reasons to visit Hermann."

MISSOURI IS IDEAL FOR CREATING BOURBON THANKS TO TWO NATURAL ADVANTAGES

Even before the legislation passed into law, some Missouri distillers like **Wood Hat Spirits** in New Florence were following the guidelines set forth in it. Owner Gary Hinegardner uses his own heritage corns for his bourbons. This advantage allowed Hinegardner and several other distilleries to use the official label right away. Others began implementing new processes upon the bill's passage, and those bourbons are now on the market.

The original push for Missouri bourbon may have come from the craft distillers, but the big boys are on

board, too. **Holladay Distillery** in Weston is the oldest distillery in continuous operation west of the Mississippi; staying in business through Prohibition by producing alcohol for medicinal use.

Holladay Distillery's Jordan Germano explains that Missouri is ideal for creating bourbon thanks to two natural advantages. Active limestone springs — first charted by Lewis and Clark, they provide minerality and filter out impurities that affect flavor — and the extreme heat and cold in the state (aging warehouses are not climate controlled) moves the bourbon around in the barrels, pulling more flavor out of the wood. The distillery's new bourbon is called Ben Holladay Missouri Straight Bourbon Whiskey, after their original founder.

Holladay released their six-year bourbon last year, and according to Gosen, "It's phenomenal. Six years is the sweet spot on bourbon." And when it's a competitor speaking, that is high praise indeed.

But whether you're new to bourbon, an established fan, a purist or you prefer mixed drinks, remember: There's no wrong way to drink Missouri bourbon. The only mistake is not enjoying it.

BEGINNER'S GUIDE

DRINKING BOURBON

hen choosing a bourbon, look for the word "Straight" on the label. It means the spirit has been aged at least two years. Not all labels provide information on how long the bourbon has been aged, but the longer the aging, the smoother the product.

Many connoisseurs believe there are only three ways to drink bourbon: neat, on the rocks and with a splash of water. And they mean JUST a splash. A little dilution takes the edge off the

heat and spice notes and lets the sweetness shine through

Skip the shot glass. To really enjoy bourbon, you should pour it slowly into a glass with a wide mouth, only filling the glass a quarter of the way. Let the bourbon settle for a few seconds, then place the glass at your lips, leaving your nose in the glass so you are able to smell and taste it at the same time, really taking in all the notes of the aged bourbon.



If using ice, choose large pieces that will melt slowly.

TRY A COCKTAIL IF YOU'RE A NOVICE AND NOT READY TO TRY DRINKING BOURBON ON ITS OWN, MIX UP A COCKTAIL.



THE MISSOURI MULE

Created by bartender Joe Gilmore to honor President Harry S. Truman and also the Democratic Party's mascot.

- 1 ounce Missouri bourbon
- 1 ounce Applejack (hard apple cider)
- 1 ounce lemon juice
- ½ ounce Campari
- ½ ounce Cointreau (triple sec)

Shake it with ice and strain into a chilled cocktail glass.



SMOKIN' STAVE MANHATTAN

- 2 ounces Ben Holladay Bourbon
- 34 ounces sweet vermouth 3 dashes of barred-aged bitters

Combine all ingredients and stir. Garnish with a smoked stave.



THE CLASSIC OLD FASHIONED

- 11/2 ounces Missouri bourbon
- 1 sugar cube
- 2 dashes Angostura bitters

Few dashes plain water

Place sugar cube in Old-Fashioned glass and saturate with bitters. Add a dash of plain water. Mix until dissolved. Fill the glass with ice cubes and add whiskey. Garnish with an orange slice and a cocktail cherry.





Big Lake State Park CRAIG 660-771-6341, 204 Lake Shore Drive. The 625-acre natural oxbow Big Lake borders the park, which lies along a major migratory flyway. The park offers camping, premium camper cabins, a boat ramp and picnicking. FREE &

Boone's Lick State Historic Site BOONESBORO 660-837-3330, Highway 187. This is the site of the salt-manufacturing business once owned and operated by Daniel Boone's sons, Daniel M. and Nathan. Battle of Carthage State Historic Site CARTHAGE 417-682-2279, 1111 E. Chestnut St. A 12-hour battle, which began nine miles north of Carthage on July 5, 1861, ended here. Missouri Gov.

Claiborne Fox Jackson's 6,000 Southerners forced Col. Franz Sigel's 1,000 Union men to retreat. An interpretive kiosk explains the battle. FREE

 Battle of Island Mound State Historic Site BUTLER 417-276-4259, 4837 NW County Road 1002. The Battle of Island Mound marked the first time that Black troops engaged in Civil War combat. This site encompasses Fort Africa, where the 1st Kansas Colored Volunteer Infantry camped in 1862 before a battle with pro-Confederate forces near a low hill named Island Mound. FREE &

Big Sugar Creek State Park PINEVILLE 417-847-2539, 6727 Big Sugar Creek Road. This park features outstanding oak and oak-pine savannas in the rugged Elk Hills region of southwest Missouri. These glades, woodlands and bluffs lie along Big Sugar Creek. A 3.4-mile hiking trail

traverses these unique natural features. FREE

Grand Falls JOPLIN

 Harry S Truman Birthplace State Historic Site LAMAR 417-682-2279, 1009 Truman St. Harry S. Truman, the only Missourian ever elected U.S. president, was born here on May 8, 1884.

Truman's family stayed in the six-room home until he was almost 1 year old. Furnishings from the period fill the house. Guided tours are free. FREE

 Nathan and Olive Boone Homestead State Historic Site ASH GROVE 417-751-3266 7850 N. State Highway V. This log house, built in 1837, was the home of Col. Nathan Boone and his wife, Olive. Nathan was the son of Daniel Boone and a military officer and early developer of Missouri. Olive was the caretaker of the homestead and the provider for the Boone children. The two lived in the house until their deaths in the 1850s. The site features tours, a small picnic area, a picnic shelter, a fishing pond and hiking trails. \$

 Osage Village State Historic Site WALKER 417-682-2279, Highway C. This site was once a Big Osage American Indian village occupied from 1700 to 1775. Follow a self-guided tour of this archaeological remnant of the earliest known Osage village and learn about Osage history and life in outdoor exhibits. FREE

6 Prairie State Park MINDENMINES 417-843-6711, 128 NW 150th Lane. This nearly 4,000-acre park is the state's largest public example of native prairie. 





This site preserves the remains of Fort Davidson, an earthen fortification occupied by Union forces during the bloody Battle of Pilot Knob. Exhibits in the visitor center illustrate the stirring events of the Sept. 26-27, 1864, battle. The site also has a picnic area and

This park features an orientation center; stores; picnic areas; a campground; camper cabins; and hiking, biking and equestrian trails. FREE &

 Onondaga Cave State Park LEASBURG 573-245-6576, 7556 Highway H. Tour Onondaga Cave, which is recognized as one of the most spectacular caves in the nation. Bordering the Meramec River, the park offers fishing, a visitor center, a store, picnicking, camping, a boat ramp and scenic hiking trails. FREE &

St. Francois State Park BONNE TERRE 573-358-2173, 8920 U.S. Highway 67 N. This park comprises the rugged Pike Run Hills surrounding






